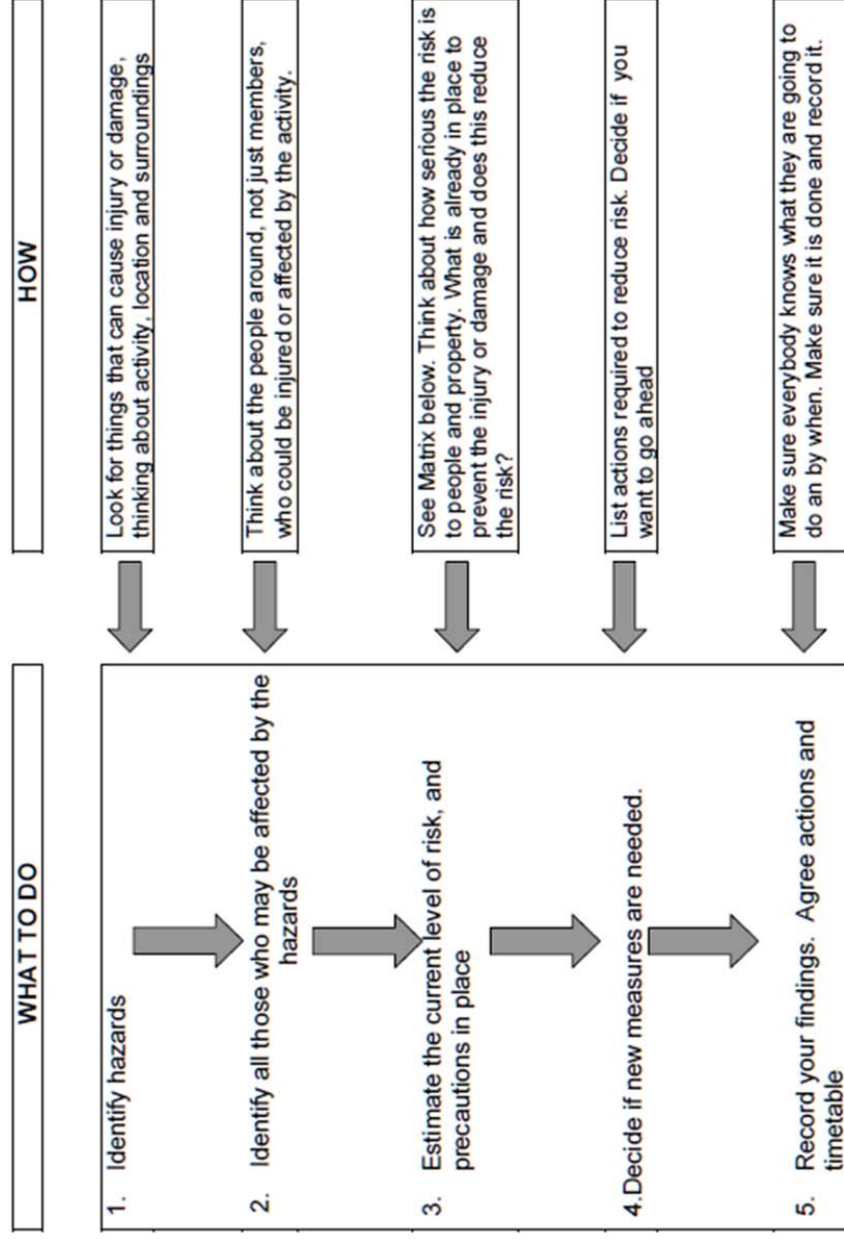

Severity	Slight Harm	Harmful	Extremely Harmful
Likelihood	superficial injuries, minor cuts and bruises	minor fractures, ill health leading to minor disability	multiple injuries, major fractures, fatalities
